SYPHILIS Transmitted by skin-to-skin contact with sores or rash.	1st Stage → Symptoms show up 3-12 weeks after having sex. → A painless, reddish-brown sore(s) on the mouth, sex organs, breasts or fingers. → Sores last 1-5 weeks. → Sores go away, but you still have syphilis, if you don't get treatment. 2nd Stage → Symptoms show up 1 week-6 months after sore heals. → A rash anywhere on the body. → Flu-like feelings → Rash and flu-like feeling go away, but you still have syphilis, if you don't get treated.		 → You can give syphilis to your sexual partner(s). → A mother with syphilis can give it to her baby during childbirth or have a miscarriage. → Can cause heart disease, brain damage, blindness & death.
HERPES Transmitted by skin-to-skin contact with or without visible symptoms.	 Symptoms show up days, weeks, months or even years after having sex. Some people have no symptoms. Flu-like feelings. Small, painful blisters on the sex organs or mouth. Itching or burning before the blisters appear. Blisters last 1-3 weeks and then go away, but you still have herpes. Blisters can come back. 		 → You can give herpes to your sexual partner(s). → Herpes cannot be cured. → A mother with herpes can give it to her baby during childbirth.
GENITAL WARTS Transmitted by skin-to-skin contact with or without visible symptoms.	 Symptoms show up weeks, months or even years after contact with HPV, the virus that causes genital warts. Some people have no symptoms Small, bumpy warts on the sex organs and anus. Itching or burning around the sex organs. After warts go away, the virus stays in the body. The warts can come back. 		 You can give genital warts to your sexual partner(s). Warts may go away on their own, remain unchanged, or grow and spread. A mother with warts can give them to her baby during childbirth.
Hepatitis B Transmitted by exchanging blood, semen or vaginal secretions with some one who has Hepatitis B.
